THE 2021 TWAS-SAMIRA OMAR INNOVATION FOR SUSTAINABILITY AWARD

- Eligible candidates: Women scientists from **Least Developing Countries** (LDCs) for their contribution in an area, including multidisciplinary work, directly relevant to the **science of sustainability**.
