Experience with Teaching:

My experience with teaching in Medicine started early on from my student years in Aristotle University Medical School, when I taught a group of my fellow students on Neuroanatomy models after lectures for the Neuroanatomy course during the 4th semester. I soon realized that my enthusiasm for the structure of the central nervous system and its possibilities had an amazing impact on them and helped them truly learn and not just memorize. I am proud to admit that our group had the highest scores in the oral examinations and the feedback I received from my peers was very enthusiastic. As a surgical trainee in Lamia General Hospital I was responsible to teach the medical students doing an elective in General Surgery in our hospital.

When I moved to the United Kingdom, I became faculty at the Surgical Skills for Students Course (SSS) organised by the Royal College of Surgeons of England and at the Basic Surgical Skills course held every 6 months in Greece, also organised by the RCSEng and the University of Thessaly Medical School. Furthermore, I taught medical students from Newcastle University how to perform neurological examination on patients, during the Neurosciences week. The responsible Consultant was Dr. Martin Duddy, Consultant Neurologist at the RVI.

Teaching is an integral part of medical training and the whole medical infrastructure relies on doctors helping to train and teach their junior colleagues, hence I hope in the future to be able to convey my knowledge and passion to both registrars and medical students alike.

Clinical audit

• "RED-GB National Service Evaluation & Long Term Survivors of GBM Project" (Newcastle upon Tyne Hospitals, United Kingdom, May-July 2016)

There is growing evidence that residual enhancing disease (RED) on early post:operative MRI scans (within 72h of surgery) in glioblastoma patients is associated with decreased overall and progression free survival (Watts et al unpublished data, Stummer et al. 2012). Early re: operation (within one week of surgery) for residual enhancing disease has been shown to be feasible and safe (Schucht et al. 2013). The aims of this prospective multi-central audit are to identify current practices of neurosurgical oncology units in identifying and dealing with residual enhancing disease in glioblastoma patients intended for gross total resection (GTR) of their tumour.

• "Do our operative notes follow the guidelines of the Royal College of Surgeons" (Newcastle upon Tyne Hospitals, United Kingdom, June 2016)

As an SHO in the Neurosurgical Department of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, I come across operative notes on a daily basis and it soon became clear to me that there were elements that did not comply with the standard guidelines of the RCS. I, therefore, did an audit on the way the operative notes are filled and I presented the Curriculum Vitae, Dr Venetia Giannakaki, September 2017

results as well as made suggestions for improvement at the Audit Meeting of the Neurosurgical Department in July 2016. I closed the audit loop in October 2016.

• "An audit on the appropriate procedure to receive blood cultures" (Lamia, September 2015)
As a surgical trainee in the Department of General Surgery in Lamia General Hospital, I noticed that there was not a standard procedure in order to receive blood cultures from patients. To add more to it, we were informed by Microbiology that in two consecutive patients the blood cultures yielded more than 4 different bacteria and attributed it to possible contamination. Therefore, I proposed we did an audit on the way we were receiving blood cultures and compare it to the guidelines. It became clear that our lack of following the standard guidelines on the procedure resulted in more than the average false positive results and we implemented the appropriate changes. We would repeat the audit in 6 months to ensure that the standards are being met.

• "Second Round of the audit on the appropriate procedure to receive blood cultures" (Lamia, February 2016)

In this second round of the audit the guidelines that we implemented on the previous audit were followed by the majority of the staff, the non-compliance rate was 8% and the results were already noticeable in the blood cultures results that we were receiving from Microbiology.

• "What can we do to reduce our surgical turnover times?" (Nottingham, March 2012)

While I was rotating at the Department of General Surgery in Nottingham City Hospital, I noticed that the time between two surgeries on a regular day was longer than the average of other hospitals. Furthermore, when I calculated the difference and multiplied it with the number of surgical days every year, it seemed that we were being counterproductive, loosing a significant amount of what should have been surgical time to turnover. Therefore I received permission from my Consultant, Mr. Simon Parsons, to do an audit about what we were currently doing and what we should have been doing in order to become more efficient. I addressed every part of the procedure leading a patient from admission to the hospital to the operating table, spoke to the people involved in every step of the process and made a list of the problems I was presented with. Then, I
